ACT I - In the Village Square

Dr. Coppelius, the toy maker, has placed his latest creation, a life-sized doll named Coppélia, on the balcony of his shop. The Innkeeper's daughter, Swanhilda, sneaks out to meet her fiancé, Franz. When Swanhilda leaves, Franz is left alone and notices the beautiful Coppélia. Assuming she is Dr. Coppelius' daughter, Franz flirts with her. Swanhilda catches him and angrily confronts him.

The Mayor enters the square and announces that a bag of coins will be presented to any couple who marries at the town festival held in honor of the new town bell. He offers Swanhilda an ear of wheat to shake. The custom is that if she hears anything, her lover "loves her true." If the wheat remains silent, her lover "loves her not." Though Swanhilda has shaken the wheat while dancing with Franz, the wheat remains silent. Upset, Swanhilda refuses to marry Franz.

Franz's friends console him by inviting him for a drink at the Inn. When the tipsy men leave the inn, they invite Dr. Coppelius to drink with them. When he refuses, they tease him. In the confusion, he does not realize he has dropped his key. Swanhilda and her friends find the key and enter the shop.

ACT II - Inside Dr. Coppelius' Workshop

Swanhilda and her girlfriends enter Dr. Coppelius' workshop. Swanhilda discovers Coppélia hidden in an alcove. Urged on by her girlfriends, Swanhilda tries to be friendly. When Coppélia gives no response, Swanhilda confronts her, shaking her, until she realizes that Coppélia is a doll. Laughing that Franz was flirting with a doll, Swanhilda lets her girlfriends in on the secret. No longer afraid, she tells them to wind up the other dolls.

Happily dancing, Swanhilda and her girlfriends are shocked when Dr. Coppelius suddenly appears in the doorway. Frightened, they run away. Swanhilda, unable to escape, hides in the alcove with Coppélia.

As Dr. Coppelius straightens up his workshop, Franz enters. Still enraged, Dr. Coppelius chases him around the workshop until Franz explains that he is in love with Coppélia. Realizing that Franz does not know that Coppélia is a doll, Dr. Coppelius invites him to drink. He gets Franz drunk, then consults his big book of magic. He plans to draw life out of Franz and insert it into Coppélia.

Meanwhile, Swanhilda has put on Coppélia's dress, switching places with her. When Dr. Coppelius brings her out of the alcove, Swanhilda pretends to "come to life". She soon tires of the game, however, and tries to wake up Franz. Dr. Coppelius, agitated by the now frantic Swanhilda, returns her to the alcove—just as she has managed to wake up Franz.

Swanhilda sneaks out of the alcove and turns on all of the dolls, bringing out the real Coppélia. Franz realizes that Swanhilda is his only love and carries her off, while Dr. Coppelius sobs over his doll, realizing he has been tricked.


